Membership Issues and Sustainability Concerns (1)

SomaliREN is currently relying on two primary income sources

- 1. Connectivity (Internet subscriptions) services utilized some members and,
- 2. Relatively small membership contributions
- Insufficient to cover the operational costs and the organization's ambitious budgetary requirements.
- This situation necessitates a careful examination of SomaliREN's sustainability

SomaliREN's Current Sustainability Concerns (2)

- Limited Revenue Streams
- Operational Costs: Limitations in maintaining and expanding its network infrastructure and services
- Growth and Innovation: Hinders SomaliREN aspires to evolve into a fully developed NREN capable
- Risk to Sustainability

 - Membership Engagement
 - Connectivity Services Uptake for the unconnected members

Technical Updates

- **Zone 1** (**Mogadishu**) Last mile connectivity has been upgraded to fiber for the following institutions and campuses from October 2023.
 - SomaliREN this fiber upgrade with Hormund Telecom
 - Significant performance has been reported after the upgraded link to fiber
 - There were LoS issues with the P2P last-mile connections to member institutions caused by growing high buildings

Zone 2 and Zone 3

- The network connectivity of these zones is not still effective and not operational due to budget limitations
- SomaliREN is expecting to benefit from World Bank's new project that has been officially launched Jan 2024 and has plans to operationalize these 2 zones this year
- Procurement expected to start on March 2024

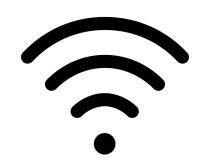
SomaliREN's Active e-Infrastructure Services

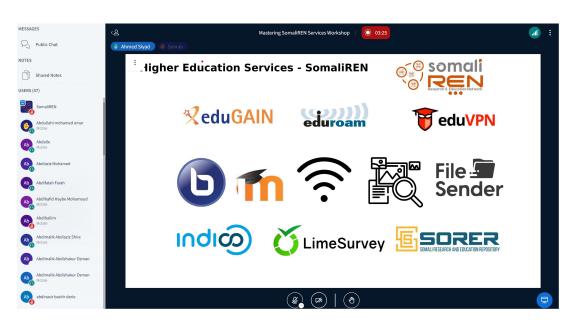
